Learning Communities are two or more classes, often in different departments, designed to be taken together by the same group of students in the Learning Community. Learning Communities are designed to connect students to each other, to their teachers, to the college, and to student learning. The classes have a common theme and coordinate their assignments. This allows students to work on themes from a multi-disciplinary perspective.

In Learning Communities, faculty members assist learning and innovation as everyone works together to create community in a positive learning environment. Students participate in groups to share ideas and help each other learn.

EDUCATION FELLOWS

The ECE/EDU Program, open to all students, provides a rewarding, supported academic learning experience for those interested in a career in Education or Childcare and offers two cohorts to support students' goals.

The Teacher Education (TE) cohort offers courses in conjunction with hands-on experience at the Skyline College Child Development Laboratory Center (CDLC) <http://skylinecollege.edu/childdevelopmentcenter/>. Students may select a schedule that includes M/W courses paired with T/Th morning internship hours at the CDLC, or T/Th courses paired with a M/W morning internship. Courses in this cohort have a section designator of TE. Students can choose this cohort for one or two semesters. The Career Advancement Academy (CAA) provides students with introductory level preparation for occupations in educational settings serving preschool children, infants/toddlers, and school-age children. This one semester, full-time program culminates with the Career Certificate: Fundamentals in Early Childhood Education. Please email skycaa@smccd.edu or call (650) 738-7042 for more information. Courses in this cohort have a section designator of CAC. The Education Fellows CAA is offered only during the fall semester each year.

Both cohorts include a one-unit course, ECE. 331 – The Role of the Teacher. All students in the Education Fellows Learning Community benefit from support and guidance through the admission and registration process, textbook support, CA Permit application assistance, professional growth opportunities, and individualized advising and support from dedicated staff and faculty. Students are supported and encouraged to apply for the California Child Development Permit at the Assistant Teacher level after completion of one semester, or the Associate Teacher level permit after completing two semesters.
