



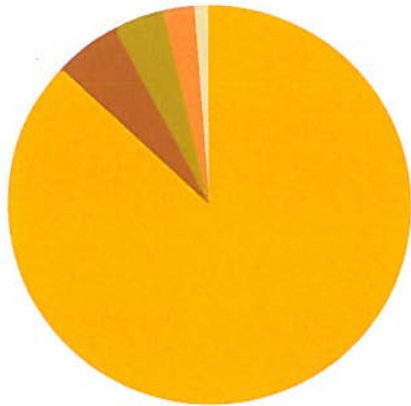
# SKYLINE COLLEGE EXPRESS SHUTTLE

Skyline College provides a free non-stop, round-trip 28-person shuttle service between the Daly City BART station and the campus. It is open to students, faculty and staff as well as community members who utilize campus services or attend performing arts, athletics, guest lectures or other college events. Made possible by groundwork laid by the President's Council,

a two-year grant from the San Mateo County Transportation Authority and the City and County Association of Governments of San Mateo County, in partnership with commute.org, the free shuttle service aims to make it easier, and more affordable, for students and community members to get to campus and make use of the valuable resources that Skyline College provides.

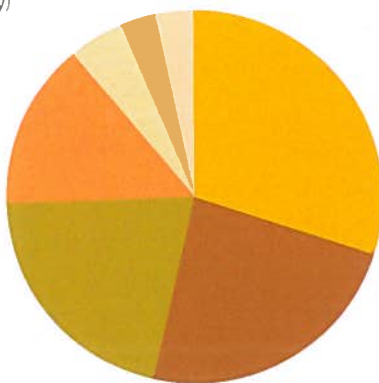
### PRIMARY RELATIONSHIP TO SKYLINE COLLEGE<sup>†</sup>

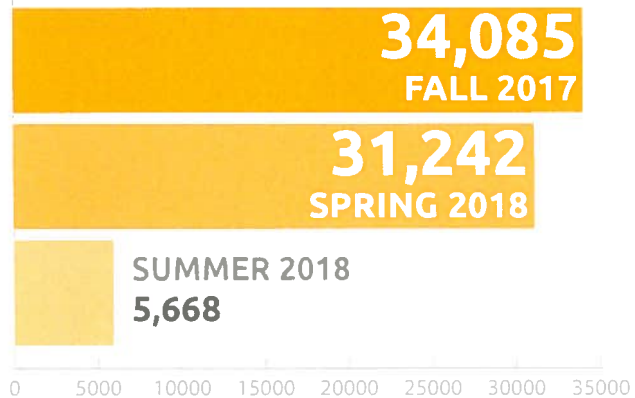
