Skyline students earn success

Former Skyline student and basketball player, Marques Benjamin, led Mayville State University to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Division II National Championship game last week. Marques was one of three players off last year's Skyline team to earn scholarships to continue their education and playing careers at four-year universities. Although the team lost in a close game, Marques played very well on the nationally televised contest. In his first season Marques started 26 of 36 games at point guard, leading the team to a 27-9 record and the Dakota Athletic Conference (DAC) regular season and conference tournament championships. He also ranked 18th in the nation in assists per game. Sam Wilhoite played this season at the University of Hawaii, Hilo. He was named to the All-Pacific West 2nd Team. Filip Popovic played this season for Seattle Pacific University. SPU finished 16th in the country in the final National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division II poll.

College Council update from March 28 meeting

- **1. Building names update**: A list of proposed building names and numbers was presented by the president to the Chancellor's Cabinet and it was approved.
- 2. ASSC update: Student government elections will be held on May 14-18 and the ASSC hopes to have online voting. The ASSC has asked campus constituent groups to consider a college hour on Wednesdays at noon, where no classes are scheduled so activities for students can be planned.
- **3. Accreditation update:** Draft 3.0 of the college's Self Study will be distributed campuswide on April 18 and will be followed by open forums.
- 4. District Shared Governance Committee update: A task force of researchers, presidents and others will be formed to review concurrent enrollment and other enrollment issues.
- Fresh Look Project update: The Fresh Look Advisory Committee will have an introductory vision meeting in May to begin discussion of the website redesign planned for the fall semester.
- **6. Plus/Minus Grading:** A forum convened by the Academic Senate will be held on April 26 from 12-2 in Room 6202 to discuss plus/minus grading.
- 7. **Program review update:** The Curriculum Committee has approved the revised program review instructional self study instrument to be aligned with the accreditation standards and will address the student services instrument next.
- **8. Smoking policy:** The Health and Safety Committee was asked to assess the effectiveness of the current designated smoking areas in light of the recent changes to the campus with the opening of Buildings 6, 7A and 8.
- 9. Commencement and scholarship awards update: Volunteers are needed for the Student Recognition and Awards Ceremony on May 7 from 4-6 pm in the Main Theatre and the Commencement Ceremony on May 25 from 5-6:30 in the gym.
