**President's Innovation Fund projects selected for 2007-08:** I am pleased to announce this round of successful proposals that will receive support from the President's Innovation Fund (PIF); they are listed in the attachment. Skyline College's annual President's Breakfast raises the financial support for the President's Innovation Fund, as does the San Mateo County Community Colleges Foundation. The goal of the PIF is to provide start-up funding to faculty and staff developing innovative programs and services. With limited funds, the challenge is always to support as many of the innovative proposals as possible. New this year will be a second round of funding available in the fall semester. This will enable projects and programs to be planned during next spring semester and presented in the Fall 2008 semester.

# Outreach to new students through our Guaranteed Enrollment Priority Program brings nearly 200 students on campus

Skyline College's Guaranteed Enrollment Priority Program (GEPP) has achieved tremendous success this year. GEPP provides a streamlined assessment, orientation, counseling process for graduating high school seniors and, as a result, provides participating students with a registration date that is earlier than the open registration for new students. This year, GEPP has attracted almost 200 students to participate in the events held on April 21 and May 5. Another one-day GEPP is scheduled on June 9. The Student Services Division looks forward to being able to continue their work with GEPP students as they move through their program at Skyline College. #### Puentistas celebrate the end of the year

Thanks to Karen Wong for the important background on this event:

About seventy-five Puente students (a.k.a. Puentistas), family, friends, and mentors came together on the evening of Friday, May 11<sup>th</sup>, to celebrate their accomplishments in Skyline's festively decorated student center while feasting on steaming chicken tacos and traditional Nicaraguan food. The theme of the evening was the landmark court case, "Westminister vs. Mendez," for which the US Postal Service plans to create a commemorative stamp this fall. This court case was filed on behalf of Mexican American families in southern California and succeeded in desegregating schools in 1947, setting an important legal precedent for 1954's "Brown vs. Board of Education." Puentistas today take their nod from these earlier activists, playing an active role in campus governance, high school mentoring and tutoring, as well as volunteering or working in community agencies. In addition to setting a record for Puente by securing about \$42,000 in scholarships, 17 Puentistas are to receive their AA/AS degrees, and 11 Puentistas are readying themselves to transfer.

The Puente End-of-Year Celebration & Graduation Ceremony on Friday was about as emotional an event as there is, as the graduating Puentistas took the microphone, one after the other, and affirmed their gratitude and, yes, love for the dynamite Puente team—our Karen Wong and her counselor-partner, Jacqueline Escobar. It was a wonderful sendoff for this team, as they will pass the torch to the new team in the fall—Lucia Lachmayr and Luis Escobar, who also have the makings of a TNT duo. There were many eloquent speeches to honor Karen and Jacquie, but one that captured the essence of this team's lasting impression on students was spoken by graduating Puentista, Ivan Martinez: "You gave us what we needed to spread our wings so we could fly...I will always be grateful to both of you for that."

# Skyline's Gateway Program looks to the future

Skyline College and the San Mateo County Workforce Investment Board (WIB) hosted a Gateway Program Recruitment Strategy Luncheon on Monday, May 14, 2007. Gateway offers math, English, reading and career development in a specially designed format of intensive support to get students ready for college and careers. With funding from the Bay Area Workforce Funding Collaborative, Skyline and the WIB will deliver a Gateway Program in the Fall of 2007 and the Spring of 2008. The first of the Gateway Information sessions will be offered during the last week of June and will continue during the month of July. These sessions will be offered in partnership with San Mateo County Workforce Development here at Skyline so that a person attending these sessions can: 1) learn about the program, 2) enroll in services through the federal Workforce Investment Act, 3) complete Skyline placement testing and 4) apply for admission to Skyline all in one stop. The Gateway Luncheon featured attendees from Skyline, San Mateo County (SMC) Workforce Development Unit, SMC Adolescent Services, SMC Jobs for Youth, San Mateo Adult School, The Career Ladders Project, and Opportunities Industrial Centers West - Youth Program. Thanks to William Watson and Adolfo Leiva for their work on this important program, and to Regina Stanback Stroud for her early and continuing leadership on it.

His responsibilities as Program Coordinator of the Police Academy also keeps him current in
