Last weekend was a memorable one for our student-athletes. At Fresno in the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) state championships, sophomore Jason Moorhouse finished in fourth place in the 125 pound division earning All-State and All-American recognition. Freshman James Anderson finished sixth in the 141 pound division earning All-State recognition. In Oakland, our women's basketball team won the Merritt College Tournament. They defeated Lassen College, Napa Valley College and Butte College in route to the championship. In San Bruno, our men's basketball team won the consolation bracket championship at the Skyline Classic.
