We will provide an update on the college's projected revenues and expenditures for next year, the deficit we are facing for the next three years, the college strategies we are utilizing to address the deficit and the district level options being considered. We will be engaged in work on the budget over the summer, so the timing of this forum is critical. It will be:

Claudia Briones has won the Genentech Scholars Award and Internship in the amount of \$7,500. Claudia is a first generation college student who is an active member of the MESA (Math, Engineering, Science Achievement program), SHPE (Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers) and SACNAS (Society for Advancement of Chicanos and Native Americans in Science) organizations at Skyline College. As an NIH (National Institute of Health) Scholar, she has conducted and presented her research on antibacterial properties of native herbal medicine at various conferences and symposiums. As a biological engineering major her future goal is to transfer to Columbia University and obtain a MD/PhD degree.

Pamela Rios - "Tracing an Infectious Disease Outbreak in Saudi Arabia"; (Mentor: Chris Case)


Mario Roque - "Effects of the Economic Downturn on Homeless Youth in SF"; (Mentor: Rosemary Bell)

College Budget Committee (CBC) update

The College Budget Committee met on April 30, 2009. Minutes of prior meetings are archived at <http://www.skylinecollege.edu/facstaff/GovCommittees/>.

1. **Program Review summary:** Vice President of Instruction Regina Stanback Stroud updated the committee on the latest round of program reviews. One of the outcomes of this process is a list of resource (personnel, equipment, and facilities) needs in each program. These are submitted to the CBC for consideration in the budget development process.
2. **District Committee on Budget and Finance update:** Professor Linda Whitten and Director of Business Services Eloisa Briones presented the Budget Update prepared by District Chief Financial Officer Kathy Blackwood for the Board. This included a synopsis of the various ballot initiatives and their implications for the state budget. With actual state revenues coming in at less than projected and the projection that the ballot initiatives are unlikely to pass, the district will need to prepare for district deficits from \$15 to \$25 million during the next three years. Kathy suggested that the district be prepared to make permanent cuts of approximately 10% of total site allocations, and at the same time increase revenue. There is a strong chance that at least 50% of losses from the Lehman Bros investment will be recovered. The plan to charge grants and categoricals an additional 4% to cover other post employment benefit costs, as required in order to receive federal grant money, will be implemented in 2009-10.
3. **State of the Skyline budget:** Eloisa Briones shared the “smoothed allocation” that Kathy Blackwood developed. Under this method, Skyline’s site allocation will remain the same as this year for the next three years. Eloisa also shared a three year projection of revenues and expenditures, alerting the committee that these are subject to change. The college will have to reduce its budget by \$1 million and increase the budget for hourly instruction to meet the 6% FTES goal that colleges are expected to grow during the next 3 years. The projection also lists the amounts and types of college budget reductions that have been proposed to date, including defunded positions. All college divisions continue to work on identifying further reductions to their respective unit budgets. President Morrow informed the committee that the Chancellor has

expanded the Chancellor's Council for its next meeting, and probably additional meetings for awhile, to include the vice presidents and college business officers in order to broaden the discussions around ways to reduce the district budget, review processes and recommend ways to increase efficiency. Due to the magnitude of projected deficits, Kathy suggested in her update that the district will "need to look and be radically different in 3 years from what we are now".

4. **Next Meeting: Budget Open Forum, May 14:** The committee decided to hold an open forum during its next meeting scheduled on May 14th. This will be held at the Main Theater to allow the college community to hear the latest budget updates and projections and invite questions and suggestions.
