The 'flu and you

Influenza or 'flu activity remains elevated in most of the country, including California. As a result, students, staff and faculty are still at risk for getting the 'flu and passing it onto others. The Skyline College Health Center is encouraging everyone to get vaccinated against the 'flu.

Many people don't get vaccinated against the 'flu because of misinformation about the vaccine. Below are some common concerns and facts about the 'flu, taken from the Centers for Disease Control <u>http://www.cdc.gov/flu/index.htm</u>



Can a flu shot give you the flu?

No, a flu shot cannot cause flu illness. The influenza viruses contained in a flu shot are inactivated (killed), which means they cannot cause infection. Flu vaccine manufacturers kill the viruses used in the vaccine during the process of making vaccine, and batches of flu vaccine are tested to make sure they are safe.

Why do some people not feel well after getting the seasonal flu shot?

Some people report having mild reactions to flu vaccination. Common reactions to the flu shot are described below.

Reactions to the flu shot:

The most common reaction to the flu shot in adults has been soreness, redness or swelling at the spot where the shot was given. This usually lasts less than two days. This initial soreness is most likely the result of the body's early immune response reacting to a foreign substance entering the body. Other reactions following the flu shot are usually mild and can include a low grade fever and aches. If these reactions occur, they usually begin soon after the shot and last 1-2 days. The most common reactions people have to flu vaccine are considerably less severe than the symptoms caused by actual flu illness.



What about serious reactions to flu vaccine?

Serious allergic reactions to flu vaccines are very rare. If they do occur, it is usually within a few minutes to a few hours after the vaccination. While these reactions can be life-threatening, effective treatments are available.

What about people who get a seasonal flu vaccine and still get sick with flu-like symptoms?

There are several reasons why someone might get a flu-like illness, even after they have been vaccinated against flu.

- 1. Some people can become ill from other respiratory viruses besides flu such as rhinoviruses, which are associated with the common cold, cause symptoms similar to flu, and also spread and cause illness during the flu season. The flu vaccine only protects against influenza viruses, not other viruses.
- 2. It is possible to be exposed to influenza viruses, which cause the flu, shortly before getting vaccinated or during the two-week period after vaccination that it takes the body to develop immune protection. This exposure may result in a person becoming ill with flu before protection from the vaccine takes effect.
- 3. Some people may have been exposed to an influenza virus that is very different from the viruses the vaccine is designed to protect against. The ability of a flu vaccine to protect a person depends largely on the similarity or "match" between the viruses selected to make the vaccine and those spreading and causing illness. There are many different influenza viruses that spread and cause illness among people.
- 4. The flu vaccine doesn't always provide adequate protection against the flu. This is more likely to occur among people that have weakened immune systems or people age 65 and older.

Is it better to get the flu than the flu vaccine?

No. Flu is a serious disease, particularly among young children, older adults, and people with certain chronic health conditions, such as asthma, heart disease or diabetes. Any flu infection can carry a risk of serious complications, hospitalization or death, even among otherwise healthy children and adults. Therefore, getting vaccinated is a safer choice than risking illness to obtain immune protection.

Do I really need a flu vaccine every year?

Yes, a yearly flu vaccine is recommended for just about everyone 6 months and older, even when the viruses the vaccine protects against have not changed from the previous season. The reason for this is that a person's immune protection from vaccination declines over time, so an annual vaccination is needed to get the "optimal" or best protection against the flu.

TRiO is a set of federally-funded programs that motivate and support students from disadvantaged backgrounds in their pursuit of a college degree. TRiO helps students overcome class, social, and cultural barriers to higher education.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Students must have the goal of graduating and transferring within a four-year period and meet ONE or more of the following requirements:

- ? Be a first generation college student (neither parent graduated from a four-year university in the United States)
- ? Be from low-income background
- ? Have a learning and/or physical disability

WHAT SERVICES DOES TRIO OFFER?

Governance – College Budget Committee

The College Budget Committee held its first meeting for Spring 2013 on Jan. 31, 2013. Interim Executive Vice Chancellor Kathy Blackwood was invited to share the Governor's proposed 2013-2014 budget as well as proposed legislation that will impact community colleges if passed. Highlights of the proposed budget include the following:

- \$197 Million in apportionment funding. Whether this gets allocated as COLA or growth will be determined.
- Additional \$179 million to buy down the deferrals from prior years.
- Proposal to shift Adult Ed from K-12 to community colleges (CCs). About \$300 million would get shifted to CCCs for the operation of adult schools.
- Proposal to shift \$16 million of apprenticeship funding from K-12 to CCs
- \$16.9 million to go towards online ed efforts (i.e., pilot program with Udacity and SJSU).
- Proposal to set a 90-unit cap for students, beyond which students lose priority registration and pay higher fees. If passed, this will reduce the total number of students so the state will pay less. Statewide we already see .5 million fewer students, partially due to fee changes.
- Proposal to change census date from 3rd week of classes to the end of classes savings will be put into supportive services.
- Change BOG fee waivers to require FAFSA. This would impact AB 540, older students, and students whose parents do not live here.

Policy proposals will affect SMCCD if they are passed. The picture for next year won't be great, nonetheless, SMCCD is in a much better position compared to two neighboring colleges which are doing salary rollbacks and layoffs.

Kathy also explained the results of the dissolution of redevelopment agencies (RDAs). For next year, SMCCD will have about \$6 million in one-time funding more than we counted on from cash distributions from the 13 RDAs in this county, as well as some sales of property owned by the RDAs.

The next CBC meeting is scheduled for February 14, 2013, in room 6203 from 2:10-4:00pm.

Guidelines for Skyline Shines Submissions

Many of you submit material to be included in Skyline Shines. Thanks so much for taking to time to help me keep the college informed. Here are a few guidelines that will facilitate the publication of Skyline Shines each week:

Send submission to skylineshines@smccd.edu

- Submit your article by 3:00 p.m. on Thursdays; articles received after this time will appear in the following week's issue
- Place your submission in a Word document with your pictures pasted in the document.
- Use medium sized pictures that are equal to 1/4 or 1/2 of a page.
- Use Times New Roman 12pt. font that is justified to the left for the body of the article.
- Don't forget to add a headline/title using 18 pt. bold font that is justified to the center
- Use the following commonly accepted abbreviations: a.m. or p.m. (i.e. "The event will be held from 8:00 a.m. 1:30 p.m." "The workshop is scheduled to run from 9:30 a.m. Noon."
- Spell out numbers of one or two words. Use figures for numbers that require more than two words to spell out. (i.e., "Almost eight years ago I began taking ceramics courses." And "I counted 176 records on the shelf.").
- If a sentence begins with a number, spell out the number or rewrite the sentence.
- Use the month, day, a comma and the year to indicate the date (i.e., "March 4, 2011" not "March 4th, 2011 or March 2nd, 2011").
- Add the word College when you refer to the name Skyline (i.e., Skyline College instead of Skyline).
