District Committee on Budget & Finance Meeting Notes October 20, 2015

Kathy Blackwood reported:

- District Strategic Plan
 - Adopted by the SMCCCD Board of Trustees
 - Moving forward Vice Chancellor Jamella Moore will be heading the plan and working with the colleges
 - o A publication will be prepared to be used for Accreditation purposes
- Budget
 - The State has allocated funds for full-time faculty. We will not receive any of the funding, but they added the amount we would have received to our base revenue limit
 - Out of 72 colleges in the CA CC system, 6 are now community funded. One more is close. The State has not allocated the funds that would have come to the community funded colleges. That is about \$5M. As of now, the state is not sure what to do with these funds and will just hold it for future deficits
 - The State added 8 FTE to our FON (Faculty Obligation Number). Our required number went down with the drop in FTES; the net FON is about the same. The FON requirement is about 320 and our last report was 338
- Allocation of one-time funds
 - Unused 14/15 prop 20 funding from the state. The state is distributing these one-time funds and deducting the amounts received from the outstanding state mandated cost reimbursement claims. Districts without state mandated cost reimbursement claims will receive the funds as well
 - Last reported, the amount for SMCCCD was estimated at \$6M, currently reports show SMCCCD will receive just under \$10M
 - o The Presidents from the 3 colleges have submitted their proposals
- IEPI (Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative)
 - o This program will allow for more professional training
 - o A state-wide RFA was published
 - The state is looking for a fiscal manager, but the state will manage the funds. They want a college to take care of paying all the bills and signing the contracts, yet the state will have all the control
 - SMCCCD chose not to apply
- Canvas Online class management system
 - CA has invested in this system and is making it available to the Colleges for 3 years, at no cost. The goal is to have class management the same throughout the state
 - Currently we use Moodle, at a cost of approximately \$135K per year. For three years, we would save that amount. The future cost of Canvas is unknown
- OEI Online Education Initiative
 - o A consortium is being put together to develop and share courses online
 - o This would not generate additional FTES or funding
 - Would be helpful to our students

 For participating colleges, the students would be able to register for these shared online courses directly through their respective colleges registration process

Jonathan Bissell made a presentation on CCCE (Community, Continuing and Corporate Education)

- The goal of the CCCE is to "complement" the programs already in existence at the District (not compete) and help support enrollment at the colleges
- Program is 100% self-supporting
- Developing not for credit certificate programs
- Corporate Ed
 - Customized training for companies
- Assist in growing the International program at both Skyline and Cañada
- There is a new team, with a new mission
- Working with the colleges to enhance College for Kids programs
 - o Was a ½ day program, it is being expanded to be a full day camp next summer
 - Last summer they had a 3 week camp at Cañada for 70 children, and a 3 week camp at CSM for 200 children
 - o Last summer, gave \$11,000 in scholarships to College for Kids
- Working with SAMCEDA (San Mateo County Economic Development Association)
- ACCJC gave CCCE permission to launch an intensive English program at Skyline and Canada
- Developed 30 new classes for Life Long Learning
- Working with Skyline on a construction management program
- Working with CSM on enhanced opportunities for the Bay Area pathways community

José Nuñez – Bond update, Capital Improvement Programs (phase 3)

- Gave the committee a presentation he had given to the SMCCCD Board of Trustees
- See the presentation on the SPARC SharePoint page
- Swinerton won the construction management award
- In July there was a conceptual budget actual cost estimates started with \$388M
- Current program cost projections have increased to over \$607M
- Modifications were made with the help of the college Presidents, but we are still over budget
 - Recommended total program budget goal is \$530M
- With other funding, Jose has estimated the available amount to be \$481M
