# THE FIRST SKYLINE COLLEGE EXPLORATORIUM Skyline Women Engineering (SWE)

## A Quick Summary--

SWE will be hosting the very first Skyline Exploratorium at Skyline College on December 4th, 2014. This event will help stimulate interest in science, engineering, and research here on campus. We are inviting all MESA and STEM clubs to participate, promote their clubs and reach out to students who are not yet benefitting from being in a club. Right between midterm and final exam this is sure to be a needed fun event which will also show our college spirit!

### What?

We will be exhibiting a series of different science demonstrations and experiments in an Exploratorium setting on the Quad. And because we would like to create a community friendly environment during this event, we are incorporating several interactive activities throughout the day in which the student body can take part. This grew from our observation that at Skylloween people of all ages were very interested in learning first hand about physics with the few demos we brought together.

## Where? Why?

We are holding this event in the high traffic area of the Quad in order to invite and encourage students from all major to explore science and the laws of physics with fascinating hand-on demonstrations. Who knows, every year, there are several people we know who switch to engineering which has lots of better paying jobs! This is an opportunity to maybe discover the joy of science and make contacts.

# How far along are we in the planning process?

We already met several times to get help from advisor Prof Koskelo in selecting some of the fascinating physics set-ups from the lab to demonstrate to people at the event and we are working on setting up more.

# A collaboration involving the entire Skyline College community and beyond:

SWE is proud to be inclusive and would like to invite clubs to collaborate or participate. We realize that many students are not yet taking advantage of clubs so we also encourage them to bring their science projects for display. Clubs and individuals can just contact us through our website.

## Research workshop & other benefits to the students:

Science and Research Club is hosting a Research Workshop where students can walk-up and chat about how to get a project started or how to improve on a current project. This will be staffed by experienced peers who are students just like you but had experience doing a research project. Students will be encouraged to use the upcoming break to get their projects going for submission to the Skyline Research Symposium in Spring 2015. We invite students from the social sciences as well as other fields to undertake research using the scientific method. Research skills and experience are important for jobs and transfer.

## What next?

Lots of preparation has been done and our contract was approved yesterday to use the Quad. So we will now publicize the event. We already have SHPE on board. We will reach out to other partners. Just contact us. We may reach out to Early Childhood (Prof Fredricks idea), Puentes, and Becalos programs. We may invite the local middle school - one science class.

So, for us to be able to do this, (just before final exams) we will need to work over the Thanksgivings break. We are humbly requesting \$500 to help with the expenses listed. We will make up the rest with personal contribution from SWE members since we currently are short on time to do fundraising.
