- Financial support, monthly transportation incentive, student services, text book and materials for one year including next summer
- Summer Scholar Institute program to help students start at transferable level math and English class
- Accepting incoming high school graduates only
- Needs to be enrolled in full time status
- Attend a Counseling 101 .5 unit
- Attend 4 individual appointments with promise counselor
- Important Dates: Students will find out about their eligibility this week
- May 3rd is registration for promise students
- June 4th is promise Day
- Promise Math intake via MMP if student places in Math 110, they will take Math 120 during the summer scholar program. When they pass 120, they'll go into their transfer level math in the fall.
- Certain math sections will be blocked off for promise students
- Promise counselors will work with students in the summer with registering for fall transferable level math class
