Queering Pedagogy in the Classroom - Brown Bag

Presenter: Dr. John Calavitta, English Professor

This CTTL Brown Bag session will explore how to make sexual orientation and the way it impacts cultural and campus practices, traditions, and structures, visible to students. Queer pedagogy in the classroom is a way to intervene in the production of "normalcy" in classroom spaces by pushing beyond the places "where thinking stops." Queer pedagogy challenges all students because it calls into question the process of normalizing dominant assumptions and beliefs that we all hold. Queer pedagogy in the classroom encourages students to analyze heterosexuality as a category, something that is often supported, and encouraged by culture and campus culture, rather than simply experiencing it as an unquestioned norm.
