## What is the Critical Global Citizenship Education Project?

The Global Citizenship Project seeks to engage students with social and ecological issues through a pluralistic and global lens. This project aims to transform and empower each of our students to become agents of change through civic engagement at local, national, and global levels.

## What does the Project include?

The project includes the screening of two documentaries, a panel discussion, and an exhibit.

#### Documentaries (Available All Year; Community Virtual Screenings on March 13 & 14):



*Bitter Seeds* (Community Virtual Screening on March 13 at 3:30 pm): This documentary exposes the tragic impact of the American agrochemical and agricultural biotechnology corporation, Monsanto on rural farming communities in India. Watch the trailer.



*Wasted: The Story of Food Waste* (Community Virtual Screening on March 14 at 3:30 pm): Renowned chefs discuss the economic and environmental costs of global food waste and explore solutions that involve educating consumers and food suppliers. Watch the trailer.

#### Exhibit (February 13 – March 31):



We will host a traveling exhibit The Newest Americans in the library on the topic of immigration and citizenship. This exhibit, which consists of photos and interviews, will encourage students to actively engage by bringing their own reflections on their citizenship.

#### Panel Discussion (March 15 at 3:30pm)



Panelists will discuss ways in which the individual, local, national, and global are interconnected and co-produced, and how each of us can take responsibility for our choices and actions. Among our panelists will be community activists, writers, artists, journalists, and Skyline faculty
