# Skyline College New Student 5 Steps to Enrollment

As a new student to Skyline, you are participating in the statewide mandatory enrollment process known as the Student Success and Support Program (SSSP). You are required to complete these steps if you intend to work toward one or more of the following: a Certificate, or an Associate's degree, and/or a transfer program to earn a Bachelor's degree, or you are currently undecided on your educational goal but considering one of the goals listed above.

**INSTRUCTIONS:** Complete the enrollment steps below. Filling in the information for each step will help you keep track of your enrollment progress. For more details about each step, refer to the pages of this booklet.

## 1 > Apply

Once your application is submitted, your college ID number (G number) and Personal ID Number (PIN) will be sent to the email you indicated on the admission application.

## 2 > Orientation

**Exemption:** You may be exempt from Skyline College's Enrollment Steps 2-4 based on one or more of the following criteria examples:

- Completion of an associate degree or higher.
- Completion of a college level coursework in English, Math, and/or Reading with a grade of "C" or better at an accredited college or university in the United States.
- Taking courses for Educational/Personal Development (intellectual, cultural, physical) only.

Additional criteria are listed on the Exemption Petition form. Contact the Counseling Center for further information about the exemption process.



## 1 Apply

Complete the college's [online application](#). On the application, you will be asked for your intended major and an educational goal, along with some basic personal, educational and residency information.

Once you have applied, you will receive the following emails:

1. A confirmation from CCC Confer that your application was received
2. A welcome email from the San Mateo Community College District (SMCCD)
3. A welcome email from Skyline College that also includes your Student ID Number (G-Number) and Personal Identification Number (PIN)

**Q: How do I access my Skyline College student account?**

**A:** Visit [WebSMART](#) to access your student account. Your Student ID number (G-Number) and Personal ID Number (PIN) is required to access the account. [Getting Started](#) provides tutorials for accessing your student account, student email account, registration how-to's, plus more.

## 2 Orientation

**Q: Do I have to attend the New Student Orientation?**

**A:** Yes, you are required to complete orientation if you intend to work toward one or more of the following: a Certificate, or an Associate's degree, and/or a transfer program to earn a Bachelor's degree, or you are currently undecided on your educational goal but considering one of the goals listed above.

**Q: The requirements above do not apply to me. Do I need to complete Skyline's New Student Orientation?**

**A:** You may be exempt from the New Student Orientation. Contact the Counseling Center to complete an Exemption Petition form.

**Q: Who is the online Orientation meant for?**

The [online Orientation](#) is primarily for online learners. Most students complete it in 30-60 minutes. Take some time to explore the website links included within the online Orientation. The online Orientation is NOT recommended for students with limited English proficiency. Instead students with limited English proficiency should sign-up for the in-person Orientation.





### 3 Assessment

All new students who plan to earn a certificate or degree, transfer to a four-year college or university, or plan to take an English and Math course at Skyline College, may need to assess for skill level in English/ESOL or Math before registering for classes.

Students will work with a Skyline College counselor to determine course placements using the following multiple measures:

#### Student Self-Assessment (for English and Math only)

Students who have attended and completed English and Math courses from high school in the United States, may self-report specific data to determine eligibility for course placement at Skyline College:

- High School English courses and grades completed
- High School Math courses and grades completed
- High School cumulative GPA

#### Alternative Placement Exams (for English and Math only)

Students who have completed an Alternative Placement Exams (APE), and who achieve the required minimum test score result, may use APE to place into college level English and/or Math courses.

- Advanced Placement Exam (AP)
  - Score of 3 or above on the English Language and Composition or English Composition and Literature
  - Score of 3 or above on the Calculus AB or Calculus BC
- American College Test (ACT)
  - Score of 22 or higher on the English test
  - Score of 23 or higher on the Math test
- CAASPP Early Assessment Program (EAP)
  - A result of “Standard Exceeded: Ready for CSU or participating CCC college-level English courses”
  - A result of “Standard Exceeded: Ready for CSU or participating CCC college-level mathematics courses”
- College Board (SAT) Reasoning Test
  - Score of 500 or above on the Critical Reading section of the test
  - Score of 550 or higher on the Math test
- CSU Placement Tests
  - Score of 147 or above on the English Placement Test (EPT)
  - Score of 50 or higher on the Math Placement Test (ELM)
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Exam
  - Score of 5 on the IB Language A1/English HL exam
  - Score of 4 or higher on the IB MATH HL exam

#### Notice for students who intend to transfer to a college or university:

Students who have completed an AP and IB exams are strongly recommended to consult with a Skyline College counselor to determine if the exam and the score achieved will clear the major requirement, and general education requirement, at the students intended transfer college. Minimum exam score requirements vary by college and major.



### 3 Assessment

#### ❑ Placement through Prerequisite Equivalency

Students who have (a) completed college level courses in English and/or Math (grade of “C” or higher) at a regionally accredited four-year college or university in the United States; or (b) have taken a placement exam at a California Community College may use their courses and/or exam results to determine an English and Math course placement.

#### ❑ Placement Tests (English/ESOL and Math)

New, first-time college students, ESOL students, and concurrent high school students may take English, ESOL, and/or Math placement tests at Skyline College.

- The placement test is computerized and is administered through the Assessment Center.
- Testing appointments are scheduled for one placement subject per 2-hour testing session.
- Students can make an appointment online to guarantee a seat through WebSMART.
- Students are to check-in at least 10 minutes early for their appointment and should bring a valid photo identification.
- Placement test preparation and tutorials in English, ESOL, and Math can be found on the Assessment Center website.
- All tests are untimed, but estimations are as follows:
  - Math: UNTIMED, approximately one (1) hour
  - English: UNTIMED, approximately one hour and thirty minutes (1.5 hours)
  - ESOL: UNTIMED, approximately two (2) hours

#### Q: May I retest?

A: Students who do not accept the recommended placement, may retake the same placement test. For additional information, refer to the Assessment Center.

#### Q: How do I get the placement test results?

A: Placement test results will be available to students via WebSMART one hour after tests have been completed. On WebSMART, go to the following: (1) Student Services (2) Student Records (3) Placement Test Results.

A Student Educational Plan (referred to as “SEP”) serves as an outline toward your educational goals and provides you a semester-by-semester overview of classes you need to complete in order for you to fulfill your educational goals.

## 5 > Registration

Once the Enrollment Steps (2-4) are complete, you will receive an appointment to register through [WebSMART](#). If you do not receive an appointment within 48 hours, contact Admissions & Records.
