PROMPT:

In Chapters 2 and 3 of *College Culture, Student Success*, we have read about various issues relating to the college experience, including social networking, technology, and employment. In this essay, you will complete the following tasks:

1. Select one of the following readings to analyze and discuss: "Could Your Facebook Profile Throw a Wrench in Your Future?" (44-47); "Drinking Deaths Draw Attention to Old Campus Problems" (49-51); "A False Wikipedia 'Biography'" (176-179); "Log On to Learn" (72-77); "Sticky Fingers on the Information Superhighway" (78-85).

2. In this essay, you will need to (A) clearly identify the issue and explain why it relates to college students and (B) explain what colleges and/or college students can do to address the issue.

DUE DATES:

 Essay 2 Outline: Bring one TYPED copy of your thesis statement and topic sentences.
 Essay 2 Peer Review- You will bring in two copies of <u><i>at least two FULL pages</i></u> for peer review; one copy is for instructor review, and one copy is for peer review.
 Essay 2 Workshop —Bring ALL materials necessary to work on your essay during class.
 Essay 2 Final Draft- Portfolio (a hardcopy of your final draft, 2 <i>different</i> rough drafts, typed sentence outline, prewriting, peer review, and metacognitive reading
log) due in class. The portfolio must be submitted in a folder.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Essay 2 is a three to four page essay (all pages double-spaced).
- 2. All drafts and outlines of the essay must be typed (double-spaced) in 12 point Times New Roman font.
- 3. Each essay must be well-developed, which means that the essay will provide adequate supporting evidence from:

A. One of the assigned readings from Chapters 2 or 3 of *College Culture, Student Success*—you must include direct quotes in all body paragraphs.

B. Specific, concrete examples from your own experience, observations, and knowledge.

- 4. All evidence (quotes, paraphrases, and summaries) MUST be cited properly using MLA format.
- 5. Each paragraph must have at least one quote from the text and/or research in addition to specific, concrete examples to illustrate your points.
