On 03/22/2013, at approximately 1450 hours, XXXXXXXX (Reporting Party) came to the public safety office to report an unattended black suitcase left alone inside the foyer area of Building 7, across from the Science, Math, and Technology Division Office (SMT). He said that he saw nobody near it and he came to the public safety office to report it. At approximately 1453 hours, Ludivico Viray and I arrived on scene. I noticed a black medium size suitcase near the glass window and the exit doors. I then noticed XXXX (Professor) walking out of the SMT Office. I asked her if the suitcase was her and she said, "No." Base on where the suitcase was placed, left unattended, and an EMT class in session down the corridor, I called Chief Rob Dean at 1500 hours. I advised Chief Dean of the unattended suitcase and that I wanted to treat the situation as a potential threat and to assure the safety of the campus community that I was going to call San Bruno police for assistance, and evacuate the building as precaution. At approximately 1503 hours, I called San Bruno police and requested their assistance for a possible bomb inside Building 7. After talking with San Bruno police, I pulled down the nearest fire station box and activated the fire alarm to quickly evacuate the building. PSO Thommy Reyes was also on scene. He and Officer Viray proceeded inside building 7 to assist with the evacuation. Dave Ha was also on scene with his crew assisting with the evacuation. At approximately 1505 hours, I received a call from California

Alarms in regards to the fire alarm. I advised the operator that the fire pull down station was activated because of a possible bomb inside the building. I told the operator to notify San Bruno Fire to respond as well. At approximately 1510 hours, I received a call from Director Mike Celeste. I advised Director Celeste of the situation and that the building is being evacuated. At approximately 1515 hours, San Bruno police and fire arrived on scene. At 1515 hours, I made contact with Sgt. Scott Luciano. I advised him of the suitcase being left unattended and also a recent restraining order against a student, Russell Williams. I advised him that Williams had filed a complaint against our campus administrators and the SMT Division Office personnel last year. I told Sgt. Luciano that I wanted to take extra precaution to investigate the suitcase as a possible threat and requested their assistance. At approximately 1520 hours, I noticed Sarah Perkins and Dave Ha outside the north side of Building 6 with San Bruno police command staff. I briefed Sarah Perkins of the situation. I was then summoned by Sgt. Luciano. He request that I locate video surveillance of the area and the suitcase to determine who may have left it there? At approximately 1530 hours, I observed the foyer area near the SMT Office. On reviewing the video surveillance, I observed a White male adult, approximately 6 feet tall, slender medium build, and with short brown hair. He was wearing a long-sleeved purple button shirt, dark pants, and gray shoes. He was also wearing dark sunglasses. The unknown male walked inside the building (Bldg 7-Foyer) at approximately 1309 hours. He was holding the black suitcase with his right hand. He placed the suitcase on the floor against the window. He then walked away the suitcase and walked towards the entry door to the north east stairwell. The unknown male was out of camera view for a few seconds and re-appears in camera view and stopped in front of the suitcase. He slightly kicked the suitcase against the window, holding a cellular phone in his right hand, and looked around at the SMT Office. He then spoke to a White female adult, who was wearing a Skyline College EMT shirt. He briefly spoke to the unknown female student and then walks outside the building and last seen walking towards the Quad area. At 1540 hours, San Bruno police officer, Kevin McEvoy told me that he spoke to the EMT student and that she knew the unknown male's name as, "Elan." I briefly checked the Advocate files for contact information with negative results. At 1545 hours, Chief Dean activated the campus's Event Announcement System and informed all students, staff, and visitors to evacuate the campus. At 1600 hours, Chief Brian Tupper told me to lockdown the campus ACAM's system by using the "Red Card." All building with ACAM's was lockdown. Officer Reyes, Viray, and Chief Tupper manually locked down Buildings 1, Child Care, and re-checked all buildings for non-occupancies. At approximately 1605 hours, I called SamTrans bus commute to informed them that all entry points to the college bus loop is closed because of the emergency. At approximately 1610 hours, San Bruno police and fire set up a command post in Lot J and Regina Stanback-Stroud and her personnel set up their command post inside the Administration Office in Building 4. At this point we were waiting for the arrival for the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office Bomb Squad to arrive to access the suspicious suitcase. At 1645 hours, San Mateo County Bomb Squad arrived on scene. The team later

determined to use water canon devise to blow up the suitcase to see the contents inside. The suitcase was detonated at approximately 1740 hours. The suitcase contained debris of a brown sunglasses, pencil, and business card to XXXXXX, Book Buyer. San Bruno police collected the damaged suitcase and the al the debris for evidence. The emergency was later declared safe by San Mateo County Sheriff and San Bruno Police. DISPOSTION: Pending a supplemental report from Officer Viray Pending more contact information for Nicholas Langhoff from San Bruno police and witness statements.
