<b>ONE VERSUS TWO DAYS</b>  More attendees is more likely when consolidated in one day	Two separate Share Outs could give more time for people to respond to the prompts <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- To add, it may also ensure a more intimate crowd size for more comfort getting candid</li> </ul>	
One day for all presentations		
<b>CANDID</b>  Candid sharing of weaknesses and challenges		
Programs were able to express in a public-facing space the resources that they need to support/advance their work.		
<b>FORMAT</b>  Format is more relaxed than preparing a presentation.		
	Facilitate flow of poster board presentations to ensure constant audience at each poster?	
		Reverse order so poster session is after the panel discussion? Panel sets the stage for the basics about the program and can eliminate redundancies

		between panel and poster mingling. But people might leave instead of engaging in conversation and may not look at the posters. And starting with posters enables the CPR faculty and staff to warm up to the event.
	Layout: Smaller tables (ex: bar top tables/poster boards on easels or rectangular tables with 1-2 poster boards on table) to allow for more space for audience members to move around (large round tables were bulky and caused more traffic) and have table cloths	
	Encourage more handouts	Encourage more creativity- for programs presenting to bring handouts, flyers, student highlights, etc. -to connect more with the program
		Should there be a handout with the programs presenting and the questions they will address?
	How to provide feedback to the programs in real time, perhaps via a projected QR code	
	QR code can be provided that invites questions to address or to strengthen program reviews in the future.

	Celebration vibe - to bring in more people especially students (music? / theme?)	
<b>PANEL QUESTIONS</b>	Keep question options to two - a challenge and a success - keep it simple.	
Like that the programs can choose their two questions. But it seems like it fell into two buckets: focusing on a challenge and a success.	Anticipate the two questions that each program will answer and perhaps project it on the screen.	
	Somehow track if each program is able to answer 2 questions during panel discussion	
	Group responses to the same question together	
	Have responders mention questions they are responding to and/or display question(s) for audience.	
<b>ATTENDEES</b>	Would be good to have all deans attend to learn about each others' programs?	
<b>PUBLICITY</b>		Can the president play a more forceful role in publicizing it?
