ASSESSMENT'S PURPOSES

• Strengthen student learning

• **Spark faculty conversations** about course outcomes, authentic assessments/ assignments that are well suited to gauge student learning, expectations/ evaluative criteria, and how well students are learning

• Help students understand how course work connects to a more expansive liberal education as represented by the Institutional SLOs

INSTRUCTIONAL ASSESSMENT PROPOSALS



 Proposal #1: Keep current threeyear calendar.
Proposal #2: Assess courses every time they're offered.
Proposal #3: Establish a five-year calendar.

CURRENT INSTRUCTIONAL ASSESSMENT CALENDAR

• WHAT/ WHEN/ WHO: All active courses are assessed by faculty in three-year assessment time frames, and results entered shortly after (e.g., Fall 2022-Spring 2025). Ideally course(s) that align with a given ISLO are assessed the year when the ISLO is featured.

• **RATIONALE:** (a) Courses are assessed regularly enough to implement timely changes; (b) Active courses are assessed at least once, if not twice, between CPR cycles.

INSTRUCTIONAL ASSESSMENT CALENDAR PROPOSAL #2

• WHEN: All active courses are assessed every time they're taught and results are entered shortly after.

• **RATIONALE:** (a) Courses should be assessed every time to respond immediately to student needs; (b) Program leads no longer need to contact faculty when their course is scheduled to be assessed (though they may need to identify when results will be reviewed).

INSTRUCTIONAL ASSESSMENT CALENDAR PROPOSAL #3

• WHEN: All active courses are assessed by faculty in five-year assessment time frames so as to align with each of the five featured ISLOs (e.g., Fall 2025-Spring 2030).

• **RATIONALE:** (a) ACCJC's emphasis is on actions taken as a result of outcomes assessment, which a longer time-frame presumably will accommodate if faculty discuss results and related topics; (b) Alignment of calendar with ISLOs will raise awareness of ISLOs.
