PROMISE SCHOLARS PROGRAM

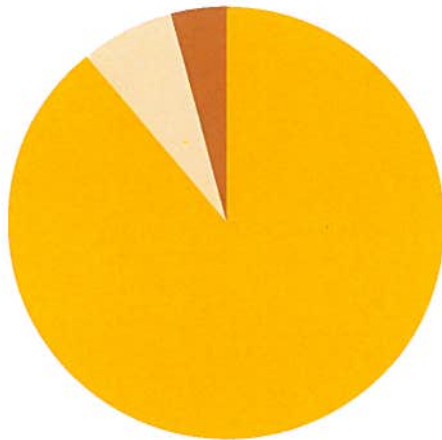
The Promise Scholars Program provides financial, academic and personalized student services including dedicated counseling and transportation assistance for high school graduates and students who recently completed their GED/HSE and who enroll at Skyline College full-time to earn a certificate or degree. The program is based on the ASAP model developed by the City University of New York which has doubled graduation rates.

The Promise Scholars Program at Skyline College has seen clear success with its first two cohorts of 140 and 253 students respectively and the data below focuses on these initial groups. Beginning in Fall 2018, the Promise Scholars Program reached full replication of the ASAP model, implementing all of the key components of the CUNY program and expanding to serve over 500 students in the Fall 2018 cohort.

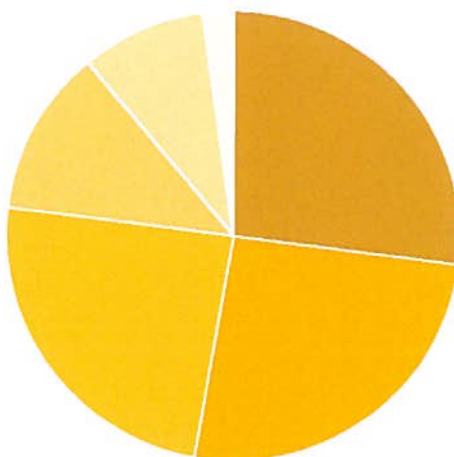
The Promise Scholars Program served 140 students in its pilot year who demonstrated an 80.0% fall '16 - spring '18 persistence rate - significantly higher than the 62.6% persistence rate of the full-time comparison group.*
