Design Build project update

About 45 people from across the college came together Wednesday afternoon to review the status of our project, and to hear about the ideas we are exploring for closing the gap between our budget and our project scope. Dozens of suggestions and comments were offered to help shape the project. The PowerPoint presentation I used to provide a briefing on the project is available via a link on the front page of our website at <http://www.skylinecollege.edu/> under "News." It includes a summary of the feedback on the project that we have received so far via the electronic form (also on that website) and via paper forms in the Student Center. It also includes a summary of the options being considered to close the gap between our budget and the cost of the project as proposed by Hensel Phelps Construction Company, including these:

- Relocation of the two buildings to flatter sites
 - Bldg. 4N to the east toward the soccer fields
 - Bldg. 11 to the existing Auto area, possibly combining it with Bldg. 10
- Reductions in square footage of the two buildings:
 - Bldg. 4N: reduction of the square footage on the third floor to open up part of the view from the Library
 - Fitness Center modifications
 - Move Multicultural Center elsewhere
- Repurposing of existing college space for some functions
 - e.g. Part of Student Center second floor
- Simplification of landscape and hardscape

The attendees at the Open Forum discussed all of these and provided many valuable suggestions. The PowerPoint summarizes the next steps, which will include the participation of the Educational and Facilities Master Plan Project Task Force and the building user groups for both buildings as we move toward the final design.

Skyline Women's Basketball Cracks the Top 15

Skyline College women's basketball team was rated 15th in Northern California in this week's Women's Basketball California Community College Coaches Poll. The top 18 teams in Northern California qualify for the state playoffs. The team's record is 15-7 overall and 2-2 in conference. This ranking is the highest ever received by Skyline in the sport of women's basketball. Voting members of the poll are coaches and ratings are part of the criteria used in placing teams in post-season competition. The women's game is the first of a double header with a men's game against Las Positas College following immediately after. Congrats to the players and coach Trisha Hosley!

Former Skyline Basketball Player Marques Benjamin Named National Player of the Week

Marques Benjamin (Skyline '06) was named National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Player of the Week for Jan. 21-27. Benjamin, a 6' senior point guard from San Francisco, CA, helped Mayville State to two wins over Top 25 opponents last week and the top spot in the Dakota Athletic Conference standings. In a 103-93 win over #23 Jamestown College, Benjamin scored 23 points and recorded 11 assists. He also went a perfect 12-12 from the free throw line. One day later in a 84-80 win over #16 Valley City State Univ., he netted 24 points, 7 assists and 4 rebounds. Marques is currently averaging 7.3 assists per game, which is 2nd in the nation.

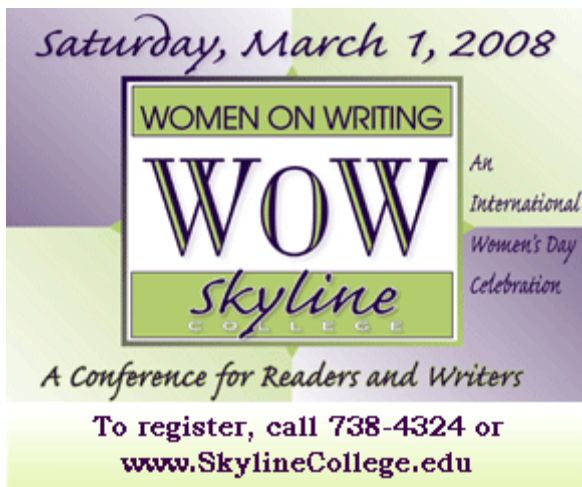
Deadline for Pister Scholarship to UC Santa Cruz is February 8

College Budget Committee (CBC) update

The CBC met yesterday.

1. **College budget for 2008-09 and hiring:** Eloisa presented updated budget scenarios for 2008-09 as well as 3 year projections from 2007-08 to 2009-10 which includes assistance from the district for 2008-09. After serious consideration of the fiscal impact of the committee's recommendation, the President approved the replacement of 2 Skyline faculty who separated this year and will be approving only replacement classified positions, no new ones in either employee category for now.
2. **State budget for 2008-09:** Eloisa Briones gave the Committee the highlights of the Governor's 2008-09 state budget proposal. Anyta Archer and Eloisa reported on items discussed at the District Committee on Budget and Finance which included Kathy Blackwood's outline of possible effects of this budget proposal on SMCCCD. Eloisa shared Kathy's proposal for Charging the Current Cost of Retiree Benefits to Grants and Categoricals The CBC recommended that Kathy meet with grant coordinators to discuss in depth the fiscal impact on our various programs.
3. **Budget Balancing Strategies:** Eloisa presented the latest edition of the "Budget Balancing Strategies for 2007-08 thru 2009-2010" which contains the college's achievements and completed tasks, as well as new initiatives. Discussions led to the addition of new initiatives and strategies that aim to increase college revenues and reduce expenditures.
4. **Enrollment update:** Cathy Hasson presented today's Productivity and Efficiency Report that shows Skyline growing by 7% compared to last year. We have generated 7,292.73 FTES which far exceeds our FTES goal for the current year.
