## Second Debriefing Forum held on the shooting incident

On Wednesday, we held a second Debriefing Forum on the September 2 shooting incident, this time focused on faculty, staff and administrators, and about 60 people attended. Brian Tupper, our Chief of Public Safety, reviewed the information we have at this point from the San Bruno Police Department concerning the incident, and I summarized the work being done by our Crisis Action Team concerning lessons learned from this unintended "live drill." Then counselors Bev Muse and Liz Llamas discussed the issues which students and employees may be facing in the wake of the incident, or any traumatic incident. They distributed a number of resources and then have placed tools on our website at http://www.skylinecollege.edu/facstaff/PIO/incident9-2-09.html. I noted that we are not only seeking to improve the communication tools we utilized (text messaging, Emergency Announcement System, email, website) but also to add others such as electronic message boards in all of the building lobbies, phone message blasts and others. We reviewed the various experiences of members of the audience and heard additional suggestions. Linda Bertellotti once again took detailed notes on all of the issues mentioned, and our Crisis Action Team will be following upon them. As usual, our eSuggestion Box is available on the website for additional ideas, and I welcome conversations and emails as well. Thanks again to everyone for the professional and effective responses you displayed on September 2 and in the days since then. If your schedule permits, please come join us to sign the topmost beam of Building 4 before it is hoisted into place.





#### Public health video contest for students is announced

Here is information from the press release: Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger announced that he is challenging Californians to join in the fight against the spread of the H1N1 (swine flu) virus by entering the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) "LIGHTS, CAMERA, SAVES LIVES!" video contest. Titled the *California Department of Public Health's Film Festival*, this video contest is intended to motivate people (particularly high school and college students) to be proactive in preventing the spread of the H1N1 virus and seasonal flu. The governor has said that "This competition allows Californians to use their creative new media skills to develop innovative and effective videos that will remind all of us what steps we can take to slow the spread of both the seasonal flu and the H1N1 virus." Californians are invited to submit either a 15, 30 or 60-second video that will be judged based on creativity, message, and entertainment value and that encourage Californians to cover their cough or sneeze with a tissue or sleeve, stay home if they are sick and wash their hands often, especially after they cough or sneeze. Students could win a \$500 gift card and have their video posted on state Web sites and possibly have it used as a public service announcement on television stations statewide. 
## **Attention Book Lovers!**
