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### Student Voice Survey – Campus Climate Review


Online survey emailed to all students aged 18 and older enrolled at Skyline College in Fall 2022

Survey emailed to 6,753 students Valid responses from 1,170 students

17.3% response rate




### "I sense interracial tension at Skyline College" by race/ethnicity

Students of my race/ethnicity are more likely to experience discrimination than other students at Skyline College




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
# "Other students treat me with respect" – Middle Eastern students are least likely to agree or strongly agree (85%)




Other students at Skyline College treat me with respect

I feel I need to minimize or hide various characteristics of my personal identity (e g , nationality, language, dress, gender presentation, etc ) to be able to fit in at Skyline College




"Instructors treat me with respect" – Black or African American students are least likely to say in all or most of my courses




Instructors treat me with respect

Course content includes and respects the perspectives of people of my racial and/or ethnic identity




"Having instructors from diverse backgrounds is important to me" – Black or African American, Filipino and Latinx students are most likely to agree or strongly agree



Having instructors from diverse cultural backgrounds is important to me


Black or African American, Burmese and Pacific Islander students are least likely to agree or strongly agree that their racial/ethnic identity is adequately represented among instructors




I feel that my racial/ethnic identity is adequately represented among instructors at Skyline College

Genderqueer or non-binary students are more likely to agree or strongly agree that they feel a need to minimize or hide aspects of their personal identity to fit in at Skyline College


> I feel I need to minimize or hide various characteristics of my personal identity (eg nationality, language, dress, gender presentation, etc) to be able to fit in at Skyline College
