Besides, advanced courses in Spanish were offered to allow students to complete their AA- T or AA in Spanish. This has happened in the past three years. Now, we have more students receiving AA-Ts and AA in Spanish. Our annual enrollment numbers are the following

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In the SMCCD, we are the only college that has so many offerings connected to ASTEP and PUENTE= Spanish, Concurrent Enrollment and Middle College= ASL, Arabic, Chinese, Filipino and Spanish; to transfer all of the above mentioned; Offered through Design Tech High School= Chinese and Spanish. We should even try to offer ASL through local High Schools too, Filipino used to be offered through Oceana High School. We should continue to do so with more advertisement in the community. Also, the Kabbabayan Learning community needs to have more of a connection with the offering of Filipino for the ultimate students success and growth of the quality of education of Skyline College.

More language sharing opportunities, more SLO assessment tools, surveys and discussions about more SKYPE and even a possible study abroad program of two weeks in Mexico are discussed. ASL and Spanish courses that integrate CANVAS and gather more students have been implemented and the AA-T in Spanish is thriving, having more students every year interested in becoming Spanish majors or minoring in it. Design Tech High School and its Skyline College classes are developing well with Chinese and Spanish on their campus. Our Middle College students and Concurrent enrollment ones are obtaining good results in the Spanish classes. The Arabic class in the evenings gather many students. So, therefore, overall, the WL Program is growing steadily and if the scheduling of classes is planned wisely, we can continue to grow without having to ever cancel classes for lack of sufficient enrollment. More outreach and support from the administration of the college will help us advertise our great offerings.

It is essential that Filipino classes continue to be offered on campus as connected to the Kabbabayan Program, and that they can also be offered again through Oceana High School for members of the community to be able to take Filipino as well. Spanish 130 on campus should have a section destined to the Puente students. The Puente Coordinator and the College administrators should be more interested in keeping Spanish as part of this very important Learning Community. ASTEP and SPAN 120 have been connected and I would love them to continue to be that way for the students to be reminded that the Afro-Latino component in the culture is present and extremely important to understand the History of the Spanish-speaking world. The other languages also should continue to be offered through High Schools for the community as a whole to be integrated in our curriculum and the curriculum to be available to the community.
