GEOG 300 for Effective Communication (Fall 2022)

For the Effective Communication ISLO, it was determined that this ISLO was not met. In Fall 2022, 57% of the students assessed scored a 70% or higher on the Effective Communication portion of the Final Poster rubric. It should be noted that for Spring 2023, this ISLO was met (60% of students assessed scored a 70% or higher), however this was not the designated assessment for that semester. Seeing how close the gap was for Fall 2022, and the actual success of Spring 2023, we have determined that we are actually close to meeting this ISLO. Moving forward, the department can continue to evaluate this ISLO through GEOG 300 and see if rates continue to improve. If rates do not continue to improve, instructors should consider increasing instruction around visual communication in the final poster assignment. Because this ISLO is part of the Canvas ISLO pilot, it is easy for us to continue collecting this data each semester without additional steps needed from instructors.

All three of the SLOs that were assessed for GEOG 300 were met. The remaining two SLOs for GEOG 300 are still being analyzed. This shows us that, of students who actually engage with the class, there is a high success rate. It was observed, however, that a considerable amount of the class (20-30%) did not submit assessments and were not engaging with the course material. It remains to be seen whether this is exclusive to GEOG 300, if it is widespread throughout the Geography Department's online courses, or if it is a college-wide issue.

Now that our full-time faculty is done with her large non-teaching commitments (FTEFAC committee, tenure

review), we are planning on focusing on our remaining department SLOs and PSLOs and have their analysis completed during the Spring 2025 semester.

The Geography Department has been heavily involved in the creation of the new Global Studies AA-T program, along with the creation of two new Global Studies courses: GBST 101 (Introduction to Global Studies) and GBST 102 (Global Issues). The Global Studies degree program and its assessment is currently housed under Geography. These courses are effective Fall 2024 and the AA-T is pending approval as of Fall 2024.

For the 2024-2025 Academic Year, the Geography Department has been a part of two President Innovation Fund (PIF) projects: 1) Critical Global Citizenship Education (CGCE) and 2) Earth Day Every Day. The Geography Department also continues to be heavily involved with the Undergraduate Symposium of Academic Research (uSOAR). For the 2024-2025 Academic Year, a Geography part-time faculty member is serving on the Academic Senate.

We have been unable to secure ZTC resources for either our in-person or online GEOG 101 sections. Requests for a class set of atlases, which would make our in-person sections ZTC, have been in limbo at the Division level (this purchase does not qualify as a Resource Request). We have met with ZTC Librarian faculty, and have not been able to identify a comparable free online atlas.

During the 2023-2024 Academic Year, some Geography Faculty have experimented with using individual lab exercises from an OER lab manual. One option worth exploring is whether or not implementing this OER lab manual in its entirety is enough to replace the need for a ZTC online atlas. There are concerns regarding leaked online answer keys, which has been a problem in the past for lab manual textbooks.

In our last Resource Request cycle, the Geography Department was able to secure three new pieces of lab equipment: 1) a solar system model, 2) a microscope, and 3) a handheld weather station.

The Solar System Model has been used in the Spring 2024 Partial Solar Eclipse Event, and in the Fall 2024 inperson section of GEOG 100.

The microscope and weather station have not yet been deployed in the lab section.

A separate piece of lab equipment, a 3D topographic volcano model, was successfully used to demonstrate topographic maps in Fall 2024 in-person GEOG 101.
