The above assessment chart is repeated twice within the ADMJ Program's 7-year CPR cycle. The ADMJ Program assesses its 8 courses and the Program at least once every three years (twice within its 7-year CPR cycle.) Each course measures its three SLOs using a pre-test/post-test, major assignment, and an exit survey. The ADMJ Program measures its four PSLOs using a pre-test/post-test and an exit survey. Program assessment data is collected every spring and fall from students completing the ADMJ Program. All three SLOs of a course are assessed and analyzed in the same semester (as shown above), data entered into *Improve* the following semester, and actions implemented at the next in-person course offering. *Improve* assessment reports are submitted to the Offices of Instruction and PRIE, and are included in the Program Review Updates (PRU) and Comprehensive Program Review (CPR). The ADMJ Program's last CPR was April of 2017. Its next CPR is scheduled for April of 2024. LEGL 304/306 are assessed concurrently with ADMJ 104/106 and incorporated together into one *Improve* Report. This calendar is aligned with the College's ISLO Assessment Cycle. Selected ADMJ courses are earmarked (*far right of chart*), if needed, for ISLO assessment. Assessed courses are only those offered in the in-person modality because they also include online (Canvas) instruction and learning aspects during the semester.
