

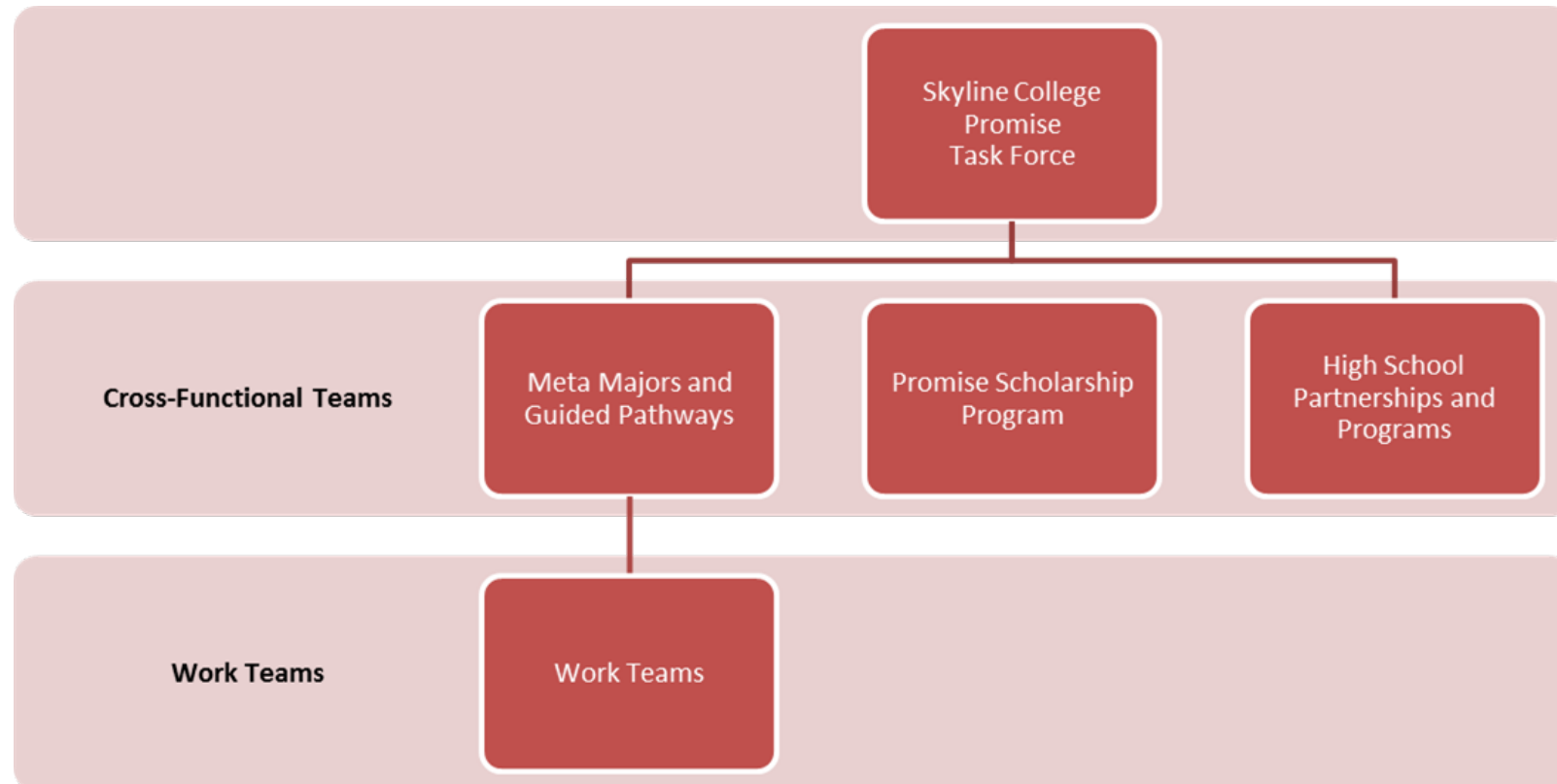

Math – “The Access and Success Gatekeeper”

Key Data – Promising Results

❖ **54 of 58 (93.1%)** students enrolled in a transferable Math course (3 did not take math in the fall, but 2 placed into it through the program, 1 did not, but moved up another level, and 1 did not enroll in the fall due to personal circumstances)

Additional Program Results

- ❖ **57 of 59 (96.6%)** CRER 137 course success rate
- ❖ **58 of 59 (98.3%)** students registered for Fall classes
- ❖ **56 of 58 (96.5%)** students enrolled in transferable English course
- ❖ **57 of 58 (98.2%)** have completed student education plan

Select Student Feedback

- ❖ Exposure to campus resources = **93%/100%**
- ❖ SSI created supportive community = **98%/100%**
- ❖ SSI helped adjust to college expectations = **96%/100%**
- ❖ Writing skills have improved due to SSI = **80%/95%**
- ❖ Math skills have improved due to SSI = **87%/96%**
- ❖ Increased my ability to succeed in fall semester = **96%/100%**

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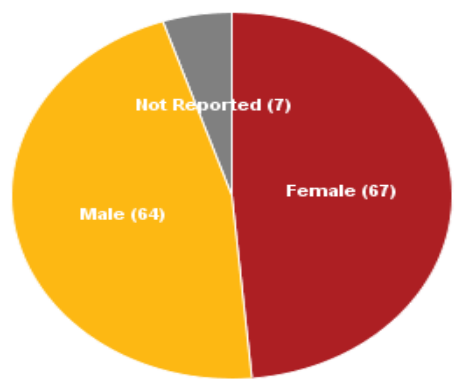
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Promise Scholarship Student Count Demographics

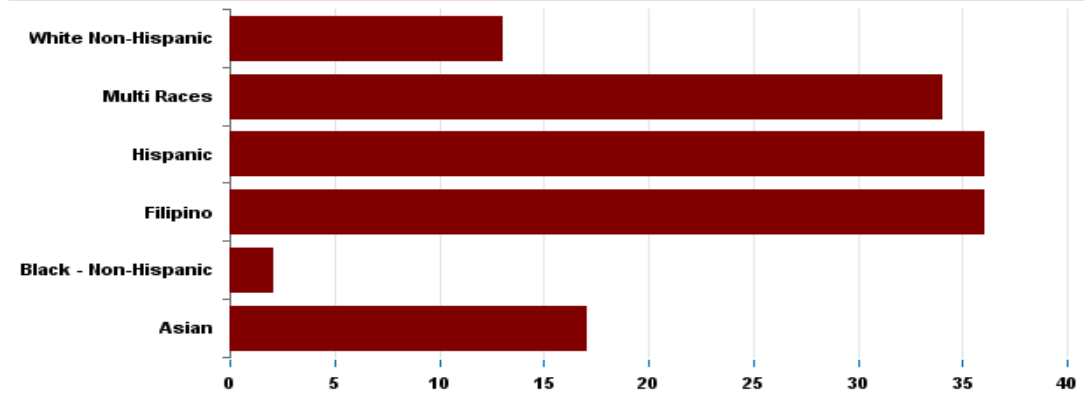

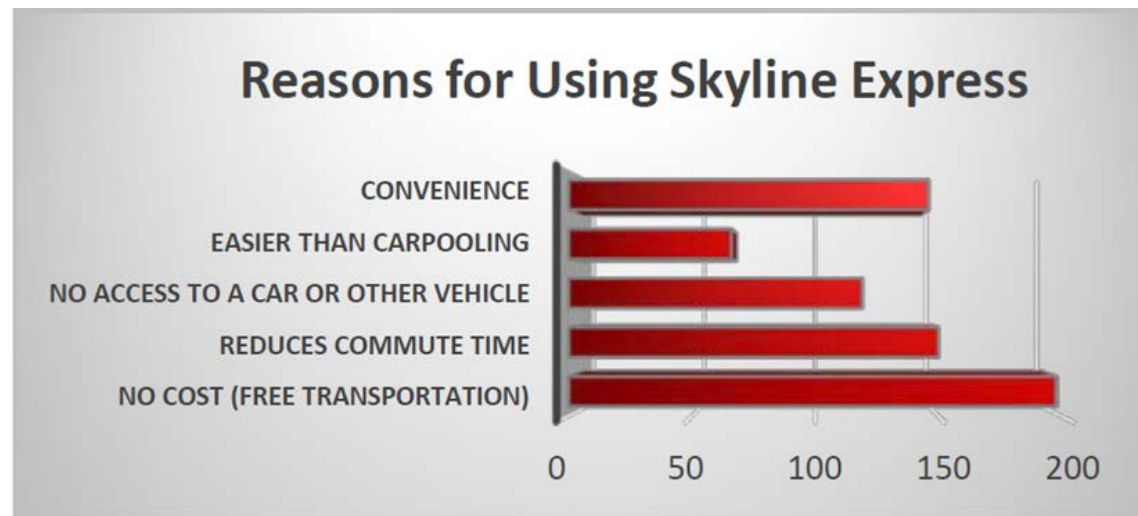

 - Minimizing transportation barriers
 - Helping students get to class on time
 - Primary mode of transportation

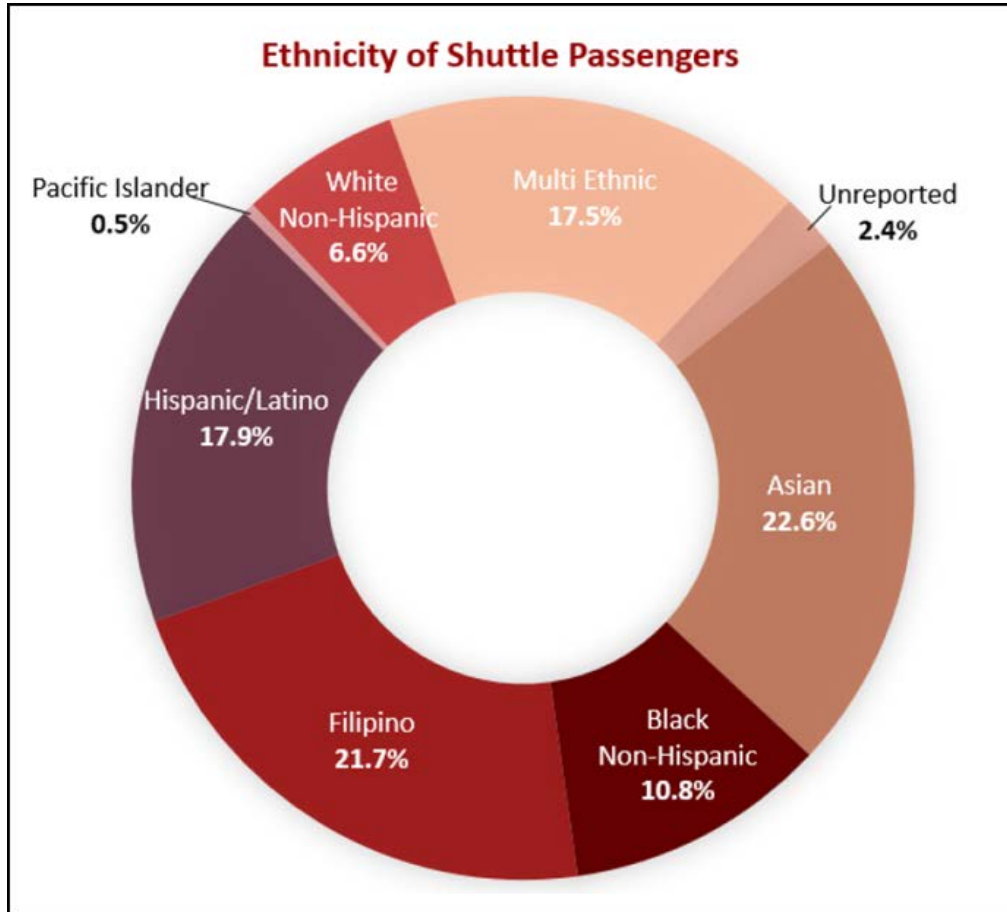
