Background – Quick History

AB 1725 (1988) and **Title 5** regulations require CCCs to create opportunities for faculty, students, classified employees and administrators to engage in participatory governance.

Leads CC Boards, Districts and Colleges to create policies, structures, committees, handbooks, etc. outlining how this will work locally. SMCCCD <u>Board Policy 2510</u>

Skyline's last Participatory Governance handbook was published in <u>2012</u>... Since then, relying on college website, compendium (no longer published), CGC minutes of approved changes...
