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CCC Dreamer Survey

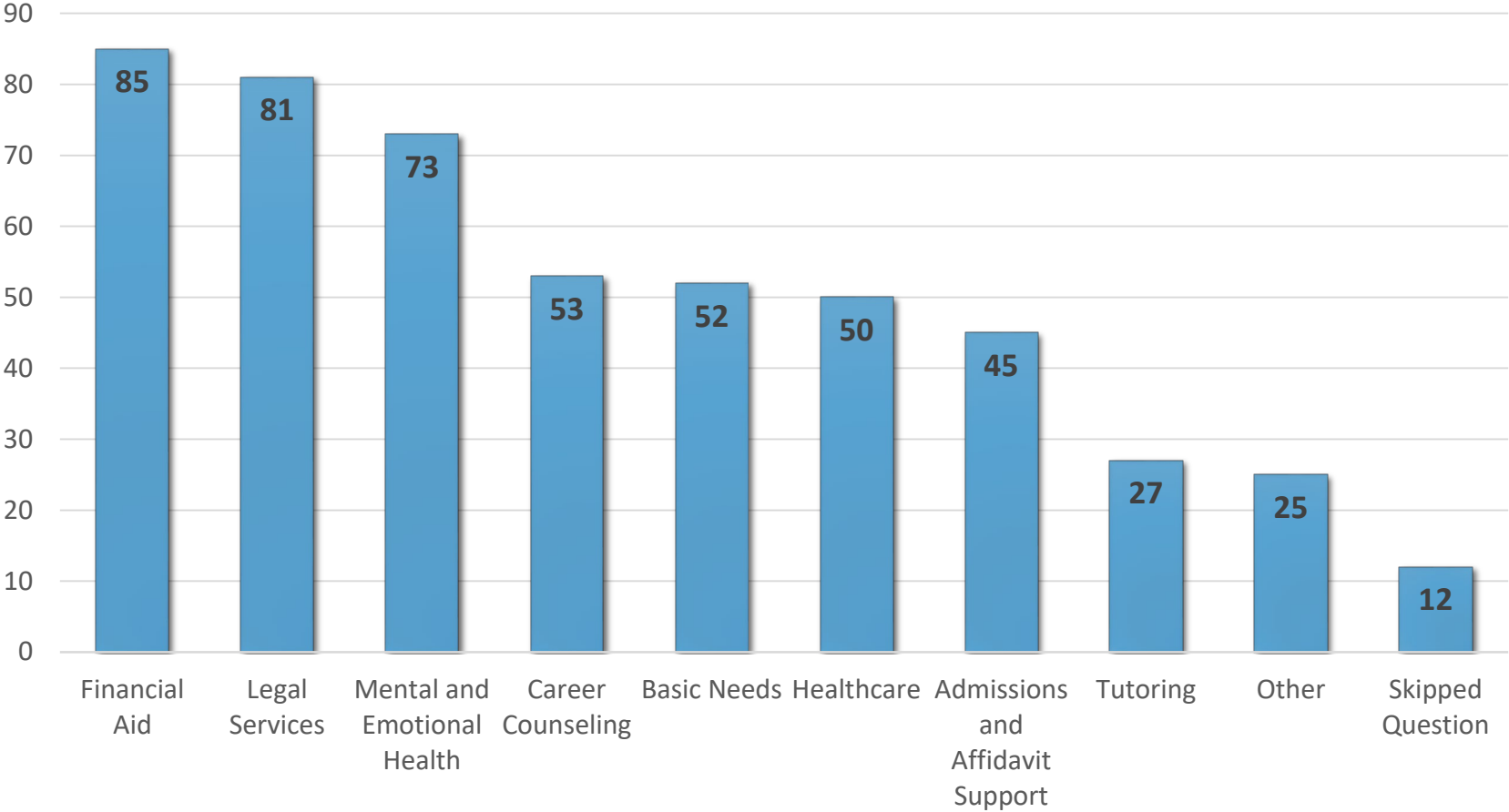


- 2018 CCC Dreamers Project
- 52 question online survey
- 111 CCC's completed the survey, 97% response rate

The survey requested information about the college's campus and district, undocumented students, primary contacts, resource centers, student services and organizations, faculty and staff training and advocacy, departmental websites and contact information, student data, visible support, institutional challenges and promising practices, and future regional meeting interest.

To holistically provide undocumented students a cohort model of success featuring wraparound services, financial assistance, and academic support.



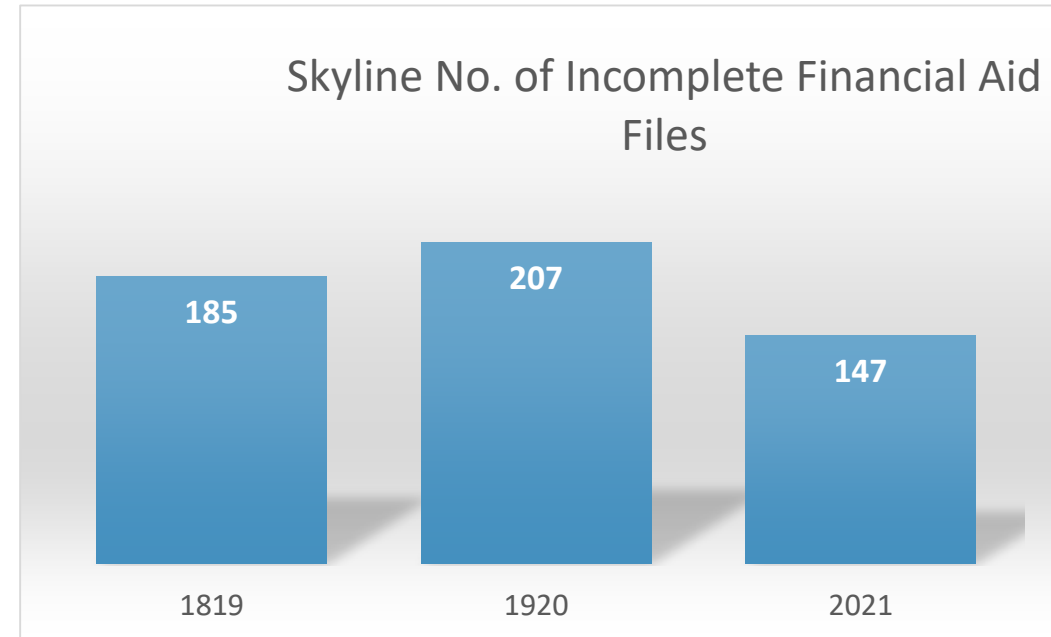

Personal Counseling

- Specialized mental health provider to ensure provision of culturally competent services for undocumented students, including trauma therapy.
- 20 hours per week



Program Criteria



- Actively enrolled
- Residency codes – 5,6,7,A and N
- Complete the Dream Act or CCPG application
- Not currently in the Promise Scholars Program or EOPS
- Attend a La Clave informational session

Student Program Requirements

- Two counseling appointments per semester
- Mid-term progress reports
- Attend one workshop/activity per semester
 - Dream Center



Program Cost

Total Cost:
\$372,744

- Serve 50 students
- Full-Time Program Services Coordinator: \$79,500
- Part-Time Personal Counselor: \$44,748
- Full-Time Counselor: \$89,496
- Books and supplies: \$54,550
- Enrollment Fees: \$61,450 (Non-CCPG recipient)
- Institutional Fees: \$6,750
- Food Vouchers: \$30,000 (\$50 per month)
- UC, CSU, and private colleges application cost (up to \$250 per student): \$6,250

Foundation Emergency Scholarship (spring 2020)

- Students awarded: 126
- Scholarship amount: \$322
- Total Disbursed: \$40,572

CARES Federal Emergency Grant (fall 2020)

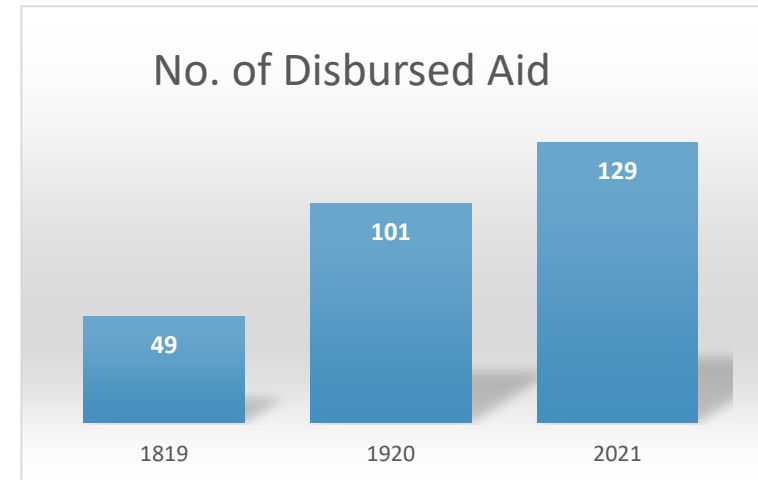
- Injunction in June 2020 prohibits DOE from imposing undocumented students from receiving funds
- Students awarded: 53
- Grant amount: Between \$500 to \$650
- Total Disbursed: \$29,868

CCC Disaster Relief Emergency SFA Grant (fall 2020 and spring 2021)

- Students awarded: 81
- Grant amount: \$200 or \$300
- Total Disbursed: \$11,100

HEERFII (spring 2021 and fall 2021)

- Students awarded: 93
- Grant amount: \$750 or \$975
- Total disbursed: \$42,525

Office of the Attorney General
