a. ASSC Bylaws updates

- The ASSC Bylaws need to be updated however the current council will not be able to approve them. The new council will vote on the changes in Fall 2023.
- ii. Updates:
 - 1. Clubs cannot cook on campus
 - 2. Compendium of Committees
 - a. All committees will be one student rep unless the Student Life Manager approves of another student rep
 - b. According to the pilot program, the student stipends are currently \$100 but come out of students' financial aid and W9 forms. If too much money is taken out of financial aid packages and the unmet need exceeds the Skyline College tuition, then students will need to pay back the difference. Currently, student stipends are dispersed via W9 or scholarships
 - c. Moving forward, student stipends will be dispersed via scholarship.
 - d. Starting Fall 2023, the bylaws will be changed so student stipends are \$25 to avoid complications. A complication that arises is how Marcy needs to ask for W-9 forms for student representatives if the stipends exceed \$600. However, for international students and undocumented citizens, they are not able to provide W-9 forms.
 - e. The Student Life Manager wants to urge the committees to take minutes so that student representatives' time are compensated for.
 - f. ASSC will no longer do film screenings as it costs \$450 a film for the rights. Clubs will not be able to be funded by ASSC for film screenings.
- iii. The executive council will be meeting over the summer to work out planning for the next school year.

 - Clubs will have to attend SOCC meetings to receive SOCC funding instead of attending ASSC meetings.
